

## Points of Interest:

- ➤ Tammy is a **strong supporter of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act** and the **Paycheck Fairness Act**. While a helicopter pilot in the Army, she earned equal pay for equal work and believes as a nation **we are stronger when people are paid the same for carrying out the same jobs**.
- ➤ In Congress, Tammy introduced legislation to strengthen civil rights protections and protect federal employees from discrimination based on sexual orientation or gender identity.
- Tammy to this day, has pain from the injuries she sustained in combat and her disability shapes her everyday existence. Tammy would **never vote to take away from persons injured** in a car accident or at the work place their **opportunity to explain their experience to a jury of peers** or curtail the justice system's ability to make them whole.
- ➤ In the House of Representatives, Tammy has **stood up against Republican efforts to limit damages for pain and suffering**.
- > Tammy voted against a Republican bill that would deny access to the courts by making it prohibitively expensive for injured parties to bring suit.
- ➤ Tammy's opponent, Republican Mark Kirk, said that equal pay legislation was among the most sexist legislation against women because "this very well-connected, I would say likely Democratic Party-connected lawyer, comes in and takes control of your case . . . and a right to one-third of your recovery, that would be the ultimate sexism." Kirk voted against both the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act and the Paycheck Fairness Act.
- ➤ <u>Kirk</u> said that class action lawsuits only take rights away from plaintiffs and wants to curtail their use.
- ➤ <u>Kirk</u> voted to cap damages on medical malpractice cases and cap painand-damage awards in civil suits.
